Mayor Aaron Lipsen., called the regular meeting of the Stockton Borough Council to order on March 20, 2023 at 7:00 P.M. Mayor Lipsen announced that this meeting is called pursuant to the provisions of the Open Public Meetings Act. Ordinance No. 2023 - 02

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE PRESCRIBING CHARGES, RENTALS, RULES AND REGULATION FOR THE MUNICIPAL WATER SYSTEM FOR THE BOROUGH OF STOCKTON, COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY

BE IT ORDAINED, BY THE COMMON COUNCIL OF THE BOROUGH OF STOCKTON, IN THE COUNTY OF HUNTERDON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY that the foregoing Ordinance be amended as follows:

Section IV is amended to read: The following rates are hereby adopted for the use of water in the Borough of Stockton Water System based on meter readings:

All size meters: A rate of \$3.85 per thousand gallons

Section VII. Flat Rates - is amended to read:

The flat rate user charge per year for all size meters is \$400.00 (currently \$300.00)

This Ordinance shall take effect upon its passage, approval and publication as provided by law.

OLD BUSINESS

- Discussion / Update on Worman Road Mayor Lipsen stated he contacted the engineer regarding an update but has not received on yet. Mayor Lipsen noted that the Mayor of Delaware Township had taken a tour of the road and also had concerned with opening access. Councilman Hunt stated he spoke with residents who asked to have the road moved. Councilman Hunt stated there are more steps to explore with FEMA to make the road more durable. Councilman Hunt noted he would speak with the Engineer and get an estimate to report back at a later time. Mayor Lipsen noted that FEMA covers 90% of expenses. Councilman Hunt stated the current road is unstable and needs to be stabilized regardless.
- Discussion on Tier A Stormwater Requirements Mayor Lipsen that FEMA raised the requirements which caused the Tier Change and noted the Tier change causes more expenses to be incurred by the Borough to be in compliance. Mayor Lipsen noted that the NJDEP has provided an assistance grant which provides \$75,000 which can be used towards a street cleaner and to remap of the stormwater system amongst various other required items. Mayor Lipsen stated the Borough would consider a shared service for some of the requirements to help keep costs down.
- Discussion on Water Authority Riverbank Stabilization Project Mayor Lipsen stated that grouting was deemed unfavorable and that a permit would be needed to remove the trees. Mayor Lipsen noted adding fill was not permitted by NJDEP, but that the bank would

need to be leveled out and native grasses plated to avoid erosion. Mayor Lipsen noted there were some concerns of the area not being as stable as it could be if fill was added.

Councilman Brown noted that phase 1 of the repair would take place on the west bank shortly after the project is put to bed. Councilman Brown stated that the tarps should be gone by the end of the year.

 Discussion / Update on NJDOT Communications Regarding Traffic Calming, Crosswalks, Rt 29 Repaying, and Drainage Issues – Mayor Lispen stated that the issues pertaining to Rt 29 had been mentioned to NJDOT but there has been no response yet. Mayor Lipsen also noted there is a list of items that are trying to be coordinated with the repaying project.

NEW BUSINESS

- Discussion on NJDOT Night Construction Repair of the Bridge Street Canal Bridge Let it be noted for the record, Councilman Folz recused himself from the discussion. Mayor Lipsen stated that the small canal bridge will be detoured to South Railroad Avenue. Mayor Lipsen noted the project should be approximately two to three days long. Mayor Lipsen reported the night construction was most beneficial due to traffic and business operations during the day.
- **Discussion on April 2 Gloria Garefino Day Celebration** Mayor Lipsen reports that there will be a celebration for Gloria Garefino located at the Stockton Fire House on April 2, 2023 at 1pm.
- Discussion on the Borough Playground Park: Celebrating the Life of Cheryl Kennedy in June Mayor Lipsen stated that Dr. Kennedy, a Borough resident, passed away recently in December. Mayor Lipsen noted she was a doctor at UMDNJ, professor at Rutgers University, and on the Borough Planning Board for 30 years. Mayor Lipsen stated that Dr. Kennedy's son, Ian, would like to have a celebration of life open to the community. Borough Attorney Butler advised to not move forward until a formal proposal for the event is received.
- Discussion on the Reformation of Stockton Borough Historical Commission Mayor Lipsen noted there has been discussion from residents of reforming the Historical Commission. Mayor Lipsen asked the Council to consider someone to become a Liaison if the commission is reformed.
- Discussion on Marriage License Update Mayor Lipsen reported there were some concerns with the marriage form located on the Borough Website. Mayor Lipsen noted that the concern was addressed and would be discussed in more detail in Executive Session under Attorney / Client Privilege and Possible Litigation.

MAYORS REPORT, BOROUGH COUNCIL COMMENTS & COMMITTEE REPORTS

Councilman Mann noted that the Community Outreach Committee would be at the Prallsville Mill on April 25th at 7:00 PM to have residents come and discuss how everyone can best come together for the needs of the Borough and for various ways for the residents to volunteer.

Councilwoman Hendricks advised the Finance Committee is finalizing the budget and will have the introduction of the budget in April at the Borough Council Meeting, followed by the public hearing and adoption of the budget at the May Borough Council Meeting.

Councilman Hunt reports that the Building and Grounds Committee is going to leave the signs where the State Park and Stockton Park meet for now and work on other items of concern within Stockton Park to make it safe. Councilman Mann added that Buildings and Grounds also met with Mr. Sowsian and advised to not mow all the area as some were marked to become pollinator garden areas.

Mayor Lipsen stated he was exploring various options for street line painting on Borough maintained roadways.

Mayor Lipsen reported the Borough has been looking into various grants to help fund various items such as stormwater management and water line replacements. Mayor Lipsen also noted a request for assistance letter has been drafted to be sent to FEMA.

Mayor Lipsen stated a tour was completed of Glenwood Lane regarding a possible drainage issue, and that a future site tour may occur regarding upstream stormwater runoff, which would also include representatives from Delaware Township.

OPEN PUBLIC COMMENT FOR ITEMS ON THE AGENDA

Mayor Lipsen opened the floor to public comment.

Elain Johnson, Ferry Street, inquired about who is responsible for bridge repair and keeping stream borders clear.

Hearing no other members of the public speak up, Mayor Lipsen closed the floor to public comment.
